Dear Mr. Philip Alston,

As you are aware, Tibet is currently reeling under extreme tension with reports of extrajudicial killings taking place on a daily basis. With no independent monitoring agencies allowed to function in Tibet, information is hard to surface and those that reach the outside world are sent under a grave risk of lengthy imprisonment. We, the Tibetan Centre for Human Rights and Democracy (TCHRD), an NGO dedicated to promotion of human rights have been constantly contacted for help by Tibetans inside Tibet.

On behalf of our sources and complaint registrars, the TCHRD appeals to your mandate to investigate the extrajudicial killings took place near Tongkhor Monastery in Kardze County, Kardze "Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture" ("TAP"), Sichuan Province, China, on 3 April 2008. At least 14 peaceful Tibetan protesters died when Chinese armed forces shot live ammunition indiscriminately into the crowd. The protesters were calling for the release of two monks who were earlier arrested for objecting to the Chinese "Patriotic Education" campaign in Tongkhor Monastery. Scores have sustained bullet injuries during the security forces indiscriminate shooting and we fear some of them might die at home for being unable to go to hospitals for treatments either due to fear of arrest by the police or due to monetary reasons.

Our sources reported that the family members of the dead were not allowed to carry the bodies of their loved ones and were even issued with threats of shooting them if they dare to do so. The security forces took away the dead bodies and till date they have not been returned to the bereaved families thereby denying them even the conduct of last rites for the dead.

### **Background information**

## 2 April 2008 - Chinese "work team" officials arrives at Tongkhor Monastery to conduct "patriotic education" of the monks of the monastery

In the aftermath of several massive demonstrations by Tibetans in Kardze County in March 2008, the County law enforcement agencies brutally quelled the Tibetan protesters. After a spree of arbitrary detentions, Chinese "work team" officials visited Tongkhor Monastery in Zithang Township, Kardze County, Sichuan, on 2 April to conduct "patriotic education"- a political indoctrination session that requires monks to denounce the Dalai Lama and to oppose the Tibetan protesters - for the monks of the monastery.

The chief monk of Tongkor Monastery, Lobsang Jamyang, did not cooperate with the work team during the campaign. Yeshi Nyima, a monk protested against the campaign which was later joined by other monks of the monastery who refused to cooperate with the official work team by telling, "we cannot criticize the Dalai Lama even at the cost of our lives."

# 3 April 2008 - People's Armed Police and Public Security Bureau officers shoot indiscriminately into the protesting Tibetans killing at least 14 Tibetans

But the next day the "work team" returned to the monastery with hundreds of People's Armed Police (PAP) and Public Security Bureau (PSB) officers. The PAP and PSB officers ransacked the monks' residences looking for photos of the Dalai Lama, confiscated photos of Tongkor head lama, Tongkor Shabdrung, mobile phones and other belongings. The officers arrested an elderly monk Geshe Tsultrim Tenzin, in 70's and a lay person Tsultrim Phuntsok, 26.

Subsequently, more than three hundreds strong monastic community marched towards local county government headquarters to demand their release that was later joined by hundreds of laypeople. The group left after being told that the two monks would be released at 8:00 p.m. but returned after officials failed to deliver their promise. On their way, they were confronted by a heavy presence of PAP and PSB officials which later turned into scuffle between the forces and the protesters, with police forces firing shots into the protesters, killing at least 14 Tibetans and injuring dozens of people.

Xinhua, the state run media agency, admitted the incident took place but described it as 'riot' mentioning only the injury of one government official and did not mention about the killings and injuries of the Tibetan protesters.




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

Pictures of Tibetans shot dead by Chinese armed police on 3 April 2008

TCHRD has obtained pictures of 11 Tibetans who died when Chinese armed forces shot live ammunition indiscriminately into a protesting crowd near Tongkhor Monastery in Kardze County on 3 April 2008. The protest broke out when monks of Tongkor Monastery (Ch: Donggu) in Zithang Township, Kardze County, Kardze "Tibet Autonomous Prefecture" ("TAP"), Sichuan Province, called for the release of two monks arrested for objecting to the Chinese 'Patriotic Education' campaign in the Jonastery. At least 14 are known to have been shot dead on that day, as against eight previously reported. The bodies of the dead have not been returned to the families till date.




